The ALBUQUERQUE WILDLIFE FEDERATION invites you to our annual **Holiday Potluck!**

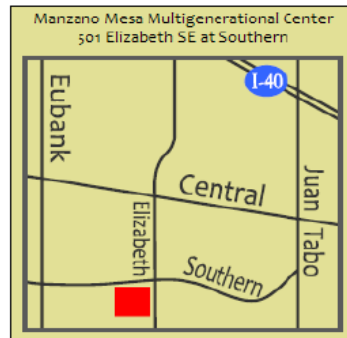
WHEN: Thursday, Dec 13, starting at 7pm.



Green Fire Wins Emmy

Green Fire: Aldo Leopold and a Land Ethic for Our Time has been honored with an Emmy® award for Best Historical Documentary at the 54th annual Chicago/Midwest Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences.

Aldo Leopold Foundation board member Rett Nelson accepted the award on behalf of the *Green Fire* team in Chicago on Nov. 18. Earlier this year, Wisconsin Public Television began broadcasting the one-hour program statewide. It will be available to all public television stations for Earth Day in April 2013. A slightly longer version has screened in theaters and over 2,000 community venues since the film's premiere in February of 2011. *Green Fire* has won awards at several film festivals, as well as a Telly Award and a Cine Golden Eagle.
