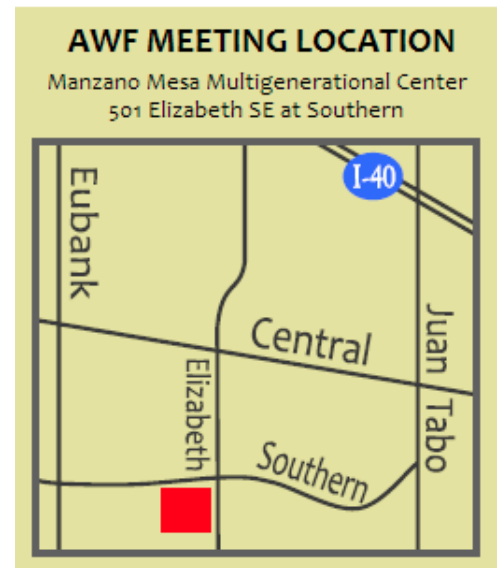

Christmas Bird Count

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 15, 2013-SUNDAY, JANUARY 5, 2014
Across New Mexico

This winter, at more than 30 locations in New Mexico, groups of bird-watchers will be counting every bird they see or hear as part of the Audubon Christmas Bird Count. Participants will be a part of more than 63,000 counters at over 2,000 locations stretching from the Arctic Circle to the tip of South America. Since 1900, the Christmas Bird Count (CBC) has provided scientists with critical data about bird populations in the Americas. Even beginning birders can join the CBC, as each counting group is led by one or more experts capable of identifying, by sight and sound, the birds in their area.

Students: Participate in the 2014 Aldo Leopold Writing Contest!

Supported by The Albert J. & Mary Jane Black Institute for Environmental Studies at Bosque School.

DEADLINE: all entries must be postmarked by January 10, 2014.

ELIGIBILITY: all students enrolled in grades 6-12 in public, private, and home schools in the state of New Mexico. (Bosque School students are ineligible to apply due to the school's sponsorship of the contest.) Students must submit original work and have a sponsoring teacher sign the contest entry form. One entry per person.

Please respond to the following: Describe what “wilderness” means to you and your community.

Entries may be typed or handwritten. The entry must not identify the author, sponsor, or school, so the judging can be anonymous.

FORMAT AND AWARDS The length of the essay varies by category as follows:

Grades 6-7: no longer than 300 words \$500 First Place

Grades 8-9: no longer than 400 words \$500 First Place

Grades 10-12: no longer than 500 words \$500 First Place

Honorable Mention(s) \$500 to be awarded at judges' discretion

Bonus Prize A wilderness library will be given to the school with the best overall entry

A total of \$2,000 will be awarded. In addition, the first place essay in each category will be honored at the *Crawford Symposium: Green Trails for the Next Generation Conference* at Bosque School in Albuquerque on February 25, 2014 and at the *Wilderness 50 Festival – Get Wild to Celebrate Our Public Lands* on October 18, 2014.

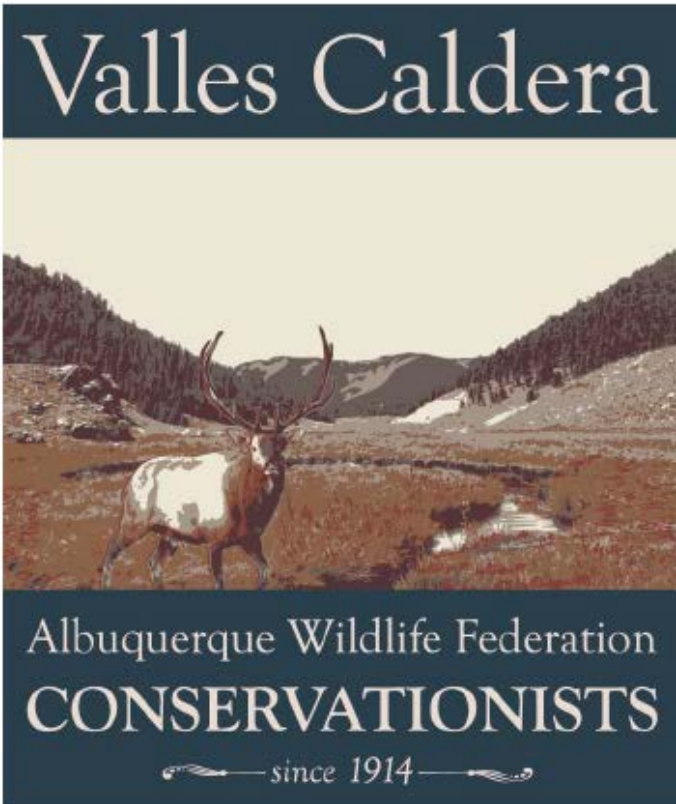
