

Albuquerque Game Body Asks Public Hunting Rights

ALBUQUERQUE, Dec. 28 (AP) — The Albuquerque Game Protective association is on record opposing ceding of public domain lands to the state unless guarantees are provided that the public will have a perpetual right to such lands for hunting, fishing and recreational purposes.

Hugh Woodard, president of the New Mexico GPA, advocated and obtained adoption of a resolution calling on the state legislature to give legal recognition to the right of the public to water in the state for recreation.

Approval of increased fees for hunting and fishing licenses was voted by a close margin.
