Guest Speaker: Kurt Menke

Topic: Conservation GIS in the Southwest: Adventures of a Solo GIS Consultant

Our speaker for the September 12, 2013 AWF meeting will be Kurt Menke, a certified GIS Professional (GISP) with 16 years of experience. He received a Master's degree (MA) in Geography from the University of New Mexico and founded Bird's Eye View in 2000 to apply his expertise with mapping technology on the world's mounting ecological and social problems. Towards this end, he focuses largely on natural and cultural resources. Kurt has extensive experience modeling potential wildlife habitat and habitat connectivity. He is the Chair of the Tijeras Canyon Safe Passage Coalition and President of the Grand Canyon Wildlands Council.

SEPTEMBER VOLUNTEER SERVICE PROJECT:

Limestone Canyon, September 13-15, 2013

THE PROJECT: For our September project, we are retuning to a favorite site of many AWF volunteers, Limestone Canyon in the San Mateo Mountains. The Forest Service has expanded the area that we are allowed to work in and we look forward to holding restoration projects here for years to come.

Our work this time around will focus on building rock structures to help retain water in the riparian area and restore several wet meadows. AWF has been working in this area since 2007 and our efforts have had a very positive impact on the stream system. Last year we were pleased to discover that narrowleaf cottonwoods had germinated in the canyon for the first time in many years.



LOCATION: Limestone Canyon is located San Mateo Mountains southwest of Socorro, New Mexico. It is about a two and a half hour drive from Albuquerque.

GEAR: Bring everything you need for a weekend of camping. For the work, don't forget gloves, hat, long sleeves, long pants, sturdy boots, and sunscreen. Warm clothes for the evenings and plenty of water are essential. Plan for unpredictable New Mexico weather, including sun, rain, and wind. Nights in Limestone Canyon at this time of year often drop down into the 30's.

FOOD: AWF will provide breakfast burritos on Saturday morning and bison or veggie burgers on Saturday evening. Please bring something to share for the Saturday potluck dinner, along with your own lunches, Friday dinner, and Sunday breakfast. AWF will provide snacks and water (please bring your own mug or water bottle).

RECAP OF AUGUST SERVICE PROJECT Valles Caldera - August 16-18, 2013

In August, AWF volunteers returned to the Valles Caldera and partnered with Los Amigos de Valles Caldera to complete the willow planting and fence enclosures we started in July and to build a number of rock structures (including several sizeable Zuni bowls, rock rundowns, and a filter dam) to help prevent erosion and hold more water in the landscape.



The area where we built most of the rock structures was at the convergence of two major drainages. When a road was constructed through the area many years ago, water was diverted into a ditch, drying out the meadows and increasing the sediment and temperature of San Antonio Creek, a major tributary to the Jemez River. Now that restoration experts are diverting the water back onto these meadows, our rock structures will help slow the flow of run-off and improve fish habitat in the San Antonio.

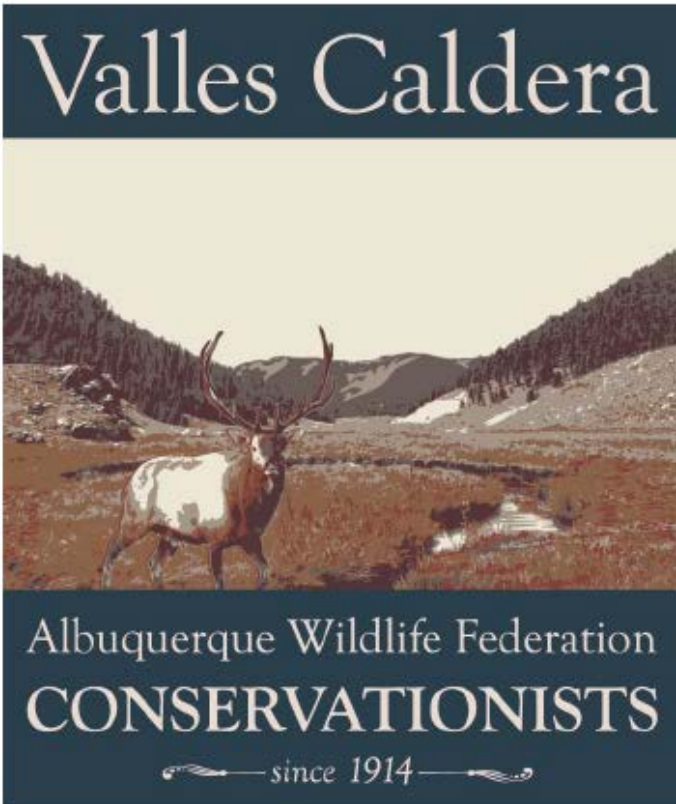
